

The art and science of choosing Lottery numbers

It's not hard for me to guess that you're reading this because you want to change your Lottery fortunes. This article will show you precisely how to do it.

First let's look at how to improve your chances of winning at the number selection stage.

The art of choosing Lottery numbers

Let's face it – when choosing the numbers on which to base our future prosperity, you daren't just rely on luck! So most of us have a 'system' that we think will do the trick for us. However, all these systems have problems.

Here are some of the most common systems:

Some people go for number patterns 1,2,3,4,5,6 at the most basic, or something a little more subtle – like – ooh, let's see – how about the seven times table. Seven's a 'lucky' number and there's a bit of maths in there. That must be worth a try: 7, 14, 21, 28, 35, 42 and 49 – and it conveniently ends on 49.

The problem with number patterns is that no sequence of numbers is any more or less likely to win than any other one. So however unlikely it may intuitively feel, the numbers 1 to 6, the seven-times table series and a random number sequence such as 8, 11, 23, 32, 37 and 45 are all EQUALLY likely to be drawn on the day. And let's face it, that's pretty unlikely. Another problem with number patterns is that you won't be the first to have thought of them and in the unlikely event of you having won the jackpot using the numbers 1 to 6 you can bet your bottom dollar there'll be a whole batch of other 'pattern-pickers' sharing it with you!

Some go for birthdays (bit of a problem about the numbers 32 to 49), house numbers, car numbers – the possibilities are endless. These are less likely to suffer from 'split jackpot syndrome' but you haven't got over the problem of how unlikely it is that your series of numbers, as opposed to any-one else's, will be drawn.

The science of choosing Lottery numbers

There is a better way. Now bear with me on this one, because at first sight you'll probably be totally disgusted and want to stop reading saying, "I already knew that". Please overcome that instinct and read on.

You need to have more lines to have more chances. As simple as that. Let's take the UK Lottery as an example. If you have five lines you have five times more chances of winning the Jackpot – even though it's still a minute chance.

You might have been investing five pounds (sterling) a week for several years and you're no closer.

What if you were to have 44 lines every week – or even 44 lines in both draws, making 88 chances each week? Now that would really start to make an impact on those odds. "Yeah, right" I hear you say. "Like I'm going to spend £88 a week on the Lottery?"

But what if I told you can have 88 lines each week for just a fiver? In fact, what if I told you that I have 88 lines each week and it costs me NOTHING? Even more incredible, what if I told you that I each week, win or lose, I get a monthly cheque from my Lottery participation?

All the above statements are 100% true, for me and for thousands of others – world-wide – who have joined an e-Lottery syndicate.

At its simplest, for just £5 a week you join a syndicate of 48 other people (who are found for you) and together you play 44 lines on the Wednesday draw and 44 in the Saturday draw. That's 88 lines for £5. The clever part is that your syndicate is given FIVE basic numbers – for instance 7, 9, 17, 23, 46 and the 6th number is generated as every other number between one and 49.

7, 9, 17, 23, 46 and 1

7, 9, 17, 23, 46 and 2

7, 9, 17, 23, 46 and 3 etc

So in every draw you'll have 44 lines, each giving you the same chance you had with your one ticket.

You need 3 matched numbers to get a £10 prize in the UK Lottery.

Suppose you matched 3 of the main numbers in an e-Lottery syndicate – you wouldn't just have ONE prize. Because you have every other number combination you'd have THREE four-number wins and an amazing FORTY-ONE three-number wins.

This effect magnifies right up to matching 5 main numbers when you would be guaranteed a Jackpot PLUS a 5 number-and-bonus ball win and many other smaller wins. At the bottom end of the scale, if you only matched 2 main numbers (a loser if playing alone) you'd still have some winnings because the syndicate guarantees you all the other numbers.

You'll probably be saying "Ah, but you have to split those winnings with 48 other people". True, but even so you will win more in an e-Lottery syndicate of this type than by playing alone.* The most basic example is that matching 2 numbers playing alone you'd win nothing. In an e-Lottery syndicate you'd have a small win, which would be added to your 'bank' and paid out when a sensible amount (decided by you) has accumulated. (* The only time you win less playing alone is if you had won the Jackpot outright.)

One syndicate member, Steve, probably a little dubious himself, continued playing his syndicate numbers on his own tickets. One Saturday he had a 4 number win, giving him £57, but with the SAME NUMBERS his share of the syndicate's winnings was over £7,000! Same numbers different result.

Look – I know this sounds incredible. It took me ages to cotton on at first as I'm no mathematician. To see a chart explaining exactly how it works look at:
